ECS-CSCI: Enhancing Community and Support for Bucknell Computer Science Majors

Goals:

- Survey stakeholders about community within CS, across majors, colleges, and years.
- Develop and plan large-scale community building events for Fall 2024




Summer Work

- Evaluate community within CS:
 - Focus groups with CS summer research students
 - Survey for current CS majors (classes of 2025, 26, and 27)
- Evaluate interest in community building events
 - Survey incoming CS students during orientation
 - Survey current and incoming students to gauge interest in departmental mentoring programs (and whether there was more interest in alumni or upperclassmen mentors)
- Plan community building events
 - Began planning to send students to Grace Hopper, the flagship conference for women and non-binary computer scientists. Also began planning an event with alumni in the conference vicinity (Philadelphia)

Some Survey Results

- Students in focus groups generally felt that the CS department had strong community, relative to other majors
- Students did not feel as connected to students in other years. Focus group students reported that it was particularly difficult as first-years who may not be taking many CS courses
- Students are especially interested in events with faculty and in departmental mentoring programs



Recommendations and Ongoing Work

- Develop peer and alumni mentoring programs within the department
 - Currently working with ACM/ACM-W clubs to do so
 - Considering incorporating alumni mentoring into CSCI 201, a seminar course students take in all three of our majors
- Organized a trip to the Grace Hopper Conference (Oct 8-11, 2024), including a dinner with local alumni
